



Cause and Effect

Here are ways to help your child practice skills while having fun!

Day 1

Listen for /d/ and /k/

Read the following words to your child. Tell your child to dance if /d/ is heard and kick if /k/ is heard: dog, deer, key, kite, dime, king.

Day 2

Read Together

Have your child read Decodable Story *Pit Did!* Find /d/ and /k/ words. Ask your child to name the /d/ and /k/ words on the Circle the /k/ activity.

Day 3

/d/ Spelled Dd and /k/ Spelled Kk

Have your child look for objects that begin with /d/ or /k/. Have your child point to the items and say the names.

Day 4

Verbs That Add -s

Say the word *walk*. Tell your child that sometimes the letter *s* is added to the verb. When *s* is added, the word *walk* becomes *walks*. Have your child add *s* to each of these verbs: *run*, *ride*, *jump*, *skip*.

Day 5

Practice Handwriting

Have your child copy the words *dance*, *kick*, and *dash*. Tell your child that these are verbs.
