



Learning About Short *e* Spelled *Ee* Classify and Categorize

Here are ways to help your child practice skills while having fun!

Day 1

Read Together

Read the following story titles and have your child tell what words have short *e*, as in *bed: The Little Red Hen, Green Eggs and Ham, Elves and the Shoemaker, Henny Penny*. Then read a story and look for /e/ words.

Day 2

Read Together

Have your child read Decodable Story *Ten*, *Ten*, *Ten*! Find and practice saying words with short *e*.

Day 3

Short e Spelled Ee

Write *h_n* on a sheet of paper. Say the word *hen* and have your child write the missing letter. Continue with *pet*, *ten*, *met*, and *fed*.

Day 4

Uppercase Letters and Periods

Look through a magazine with your child and have him or her point out uppercase letters. Also have your child point out periods at the end of sentences.

Day 5

Practice Handwriting

Have your child practice writing short *e* words.
