



Here are ways to help your child practice skills while having fun!

Day 1

Read Together

Write these q and y words: quit, quack, yes, yam. Read the words, pointing out the beginning sounds. Then help your child use the words in sentences.

Day 2

Read Together

Have your child read Decodable Story Run, Tim. Find words that have y and q.

Day 3

/y/ Spelled Yy and /kw/ Spelled Qu qu

Have your child make words by adding the letter y to the first two endings and the letters qu to the last two endings. Point to and say the words with your child.

Day 4

Verbs

Ask your child what he or she likes to do. Tell your child that these words are verbs. Give examples, such as *run*, *jump*, and *swim*. Ask your child to use verbs to tell what he or she did at school today.

Day 5

Practice Handwriting
